8:00 PM - IDEAS FOR KIDS FROM LOCAL NON-PROFITS

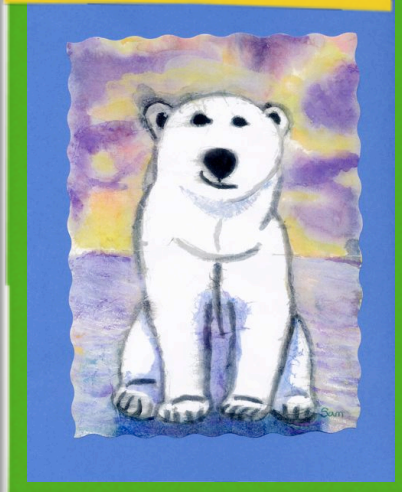
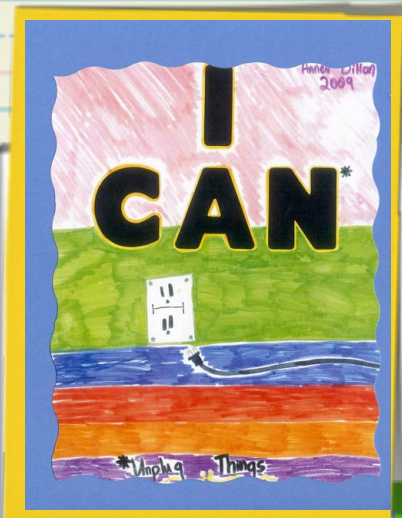
